## ~National Guard celebrates 382 years

WHO: Soldiers of the Arkansas National Guard

**WHAT:** Celebrate the 382<sup>nd</sup> birthday of the National Guard

WHEN: At 12 p.m. on Thursday, December 13, 2018

WHERE: The ceremony was held at the Morale, Welfare and Recreation (MWR) at

Camp Robinson Maneuver Training Center, in North Little Rock.

**WHY:** While much of the nation is embracing the holidays, [your state National

Guard] will spend Dec. 13 celebrating the National Guard's 382nd

birthday.

The celebration recognizes the date the Massachusetts Bay Colony's General Court established the North, South and East Regiments. These units would serve as a colonial militia, the predecessor to today's National Guard. Organized by their local government, these first Citizen-Soldiers were charged with protecting their communities.

Today's National Guard, comprised of more than 450,000 men and women in the 50 states, 3 territories (Guam, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands) and District of Columbia, continues to protect the homeland. They also provide the Army and the Air Force a proven and lethal combat force.

Air Force Maj. Gen. Winston Wilson's observation about the National Guard more than 50 years ago still rings true today.

"Civilian in peace, soldier in war," the former Chief of the National Guard Bureau stated, "the Guardsman typifies the willingness of free men to stand ready for civil emergencies and spring to the nation's defense whenever a crisis arrives."
