## **BACKGROUND:**

- (1) Reference: ARNG-HRH 24 July 2012 State Wide Vacancy Announcement (SWVA) Procedures (PPOM #12-057).
- (2) Background: ARARNG has been unable to fill the below NCO vacancy IAW AR 600-8-19 and the ARARNG MOI for 2019 EPS Board. Thus, this SWVA is implemented to identify and assign Soldiers to voluntarily fill a Traditional NCO vacancy.
- (3) **This is a Traditional “M-Day” position. It is NOT a full-time position.**

## **SOLDIER INCENTIVES:**

Any change in a Soldier’s MOS, except as provided by normal rank progression as outlined in DA PAM 611-21, is not allowed and will terminate that Soldier’s Select Reserve Incentive Program bonus, with recoupment. Accepting a SWVA slot is voluntary change of MOS and falls outside of normal rank progression. Applicants should contact the ARARNG Incentive Manager at 501-212-4028 to determine any possible termination and/or recoupment actions that may result from accepting this position.

## **DUTIES:**

Performs duties shown at preceding level of skill. Assigns duties, spot checks work adequacy, instructs, and supervises subordinates in work techniques and procedures. Determines source of product contamination in storage areas and pipelines and directs reclamation and disposition for petroleum products. Assures adherence to safety procedures and ensures keeping of efficient, clean and safe work environment. Supervises aircraft refueling and defueling operations.

## **SPECIFICATIONS:**

Physical demands rating and qualifications for initial award of MOS. The petroleum supply specialist must possess the following qualifications:

- (1) A physical demands rating of Significant (Gray).
- (2) A physical profile of 211221.
- (3) Normal color vision.
- (4) Per AR 600-8-19, promotion to MSG and SGM requires an interim secret eligibility or higher.
- (5) Qualifying scores.
  - (a) A minimum score of 90 in aptitude area CL in Armed Services Vocational aptitude Battery (ASVAB) tests administered prior to 2 January 2002.

(b) A minimum score of 88 in aptitude area CL on ASVAB tests administered on and after 2 January 2002 and prior to 1 July 2004.

(c) A minimum score of 86 in aptitude area CL and 85 in aptitude area OF on ASVAB tests administered on and after 1 July 2004.

(d) A minimum OPAT score of Standing Long Jump (LJ) – 0140 cm, Seated Power Throw (PT) – 0400 cm, Strength Deadlift (SD) – 0140 lbs., and Interval Aerobic Run (IR) – 0040 shuttles in Physical Demand Category in “Significant” (Gray).

(6) Must possess a valid state motor vehicle operator license
