III. CRWMP RULES

1. All members must attend a mandatory Membership Orientation Meeting. Each person will submit a complete CRWMP Member Application Form and Hold Harmless Agreement at this meeting. Additionally, each member must sign and submit a CRWMP Membership Agreement prior to receiving CRWMP membership.
2. At the Membership Orientation Meeting each member will receive a:
 - a. CRWMP Rules and Regulations sheets.
 - b. Wallet-size CRWMP Member Card.
 - c. CRWMP Vehicle Pass w/ UXO Reporting Procedures.
 - d. CRWMP Hunting map.
 - e. Risk Assessment.
 - f. 3Rs Explosives Safety Guide.
3. Only shotgun, muzzleloader, rim-fire, and archery equipment may be used for CRWMP hunts. **NO CENTERFIRE RIFLES ALLOWED. Cantonment areas are restricted to archery equipment only.**

4. Hunting Dogs are allowed for small game, birds, and waterfowl only. **Hunting dogs must be equipped with GPS collar and trained for tone recall.** Under no circumstances will a member enter a closed area to retrieve a lost dog. Dogs are not allowed during muzzleloader and modern gun deer seasons. Dogs WILL NOT be used to hunt Hog or Deer. Members will write DOG next to their name at sign in if bringing a dog.
5. Each member must sign-in and out at Building 6959 for all CRWMP Member Hunts. Sign-out is mandatory if leaving any CRWMP Compartment for which the member signed-in. Members may only sign into 1 area at a time. IF LEAVING THE AREA THE MEMBER MUST SIGN-OUT; NO EXCEPTIONS.
6. Member's CRWMP Vehicle Pass will be visibly displayed in the front window of the vehicle while hunting in CRWMP areas.
7. Member's CRWMP Member Card and identification must be carried while hunting. If requested by any proper authority (DPS, State Safety Office, or other designated personnel) the member must present a current CRWMP Member Card.
8. Parking will only be allowed in areas designated by the 2021-2022 CRWMP Hunting map. ALL PREVIOUS MAPS ARE OBSOLETE.
9. Each member will properly check and record biological data on all deer, turkey, feral hog, or coyote harvested during any CRWMP Hunt. A member who harvests a deer or turkey must check their game with the AGFC via website, app, or phone (877-731-5627) in order to receive a Game Check/Transportation Number. THIS MUST BE COMPLETED AT BUILDING 6959 PRIOR TO SIGN-OUT.

All required information will be entered on:

- a. 2021-2022 Biodata Collection Ledger for DEER.
 - b. CRWMP Wild Turkey Datasheet for TURKEY.
 - c. CRWMP Feral Hog for FERAL HOG.
 - d. CRWMP Coyote Datasheet for COYOTE.
10. If a member harvests a button buck it must be checked as a "button buck" on the member's AGFC Hunting License and AGFC Biodata Collection Ledger.
 11. Only legal game will be harvested. Reference Arkansas Game & Fish Commission's (AGFC) Hunting Guidebook (Zone 10) for season dates, zone information, and bag limits.
 12. For the 2021-2022 Season each member must harvest a doe deer prior to harvesting a buck deer. Biological data must be captured and the jawbone must be properly labeled and placed in the drop box.

13. All deer harvested during any CRWMP Hunt must have the following information recorded on an AGFC Biodata Collection Ledger:
 - a. Live or dressed weight.
 - b. Evidence of disease.
 - c. Antler measurements for bucks.
 - d. Sex of animal.
 - e. Lactation of does.
 - f. Method used to take the animal.
 - g. Game Check/Transportation Number (see #9 above).

14. The lower jawbone will be removed from ALL deer harvested during CRWMP hunts. Each jawbone must have attached to it a tag (provided at the CRWMP check station) labeled with the corresponding Deer Jawbone Number found on the 2021-22 Biodata Collection Ledger. Jawbones should be free of all soft tissue, hair, and blood prior to labeling and delivery. Any members planning to have the harvested deer mounted MUST remove (or have the taxidermist remove) the lower jawbone and deliver it, properly labeled, to Building 6959 no later than 1 March, 2022. FAILURE TO DELIVER OR PROPERLY LABEL A JAWBONE WILL BE CONSIDERED A VIOLATION OF CRWMP RULES.

15. All members must sign-out by one and one half hours after sunset. Members may call the Department of Public Safety (501-212-5280) if unable to sign-out prior to this time and for additional assistance (if required).

16. No entrails, carcasses, or game parts of any kind are to be left in visible sight and should be a minimum of 100 feet from road edges and infrastructure.

17. Trash and all other items must be policed by members.

18. Each member must be a safe and ethical hunter by not hunting within 100 yards of another hunter.

19. HUNTERS ORANGE will be worn at all times in the TAs regardless of date, game being hunted, or type of equipment being used. Reference AGFC for information. The only exception will be Turkey Season. **Hunter's Orange is not required for cantonment area hunts.**

20. BAITING IS NOT ALLOWED. Per current RMTTC Recreational Use Policy, baiting is defined as the direct or indirect placing, exposing, depositing, distributing, or scattering of salt, grain, or other feed that could serve as lure or attraction for wildlife to, on or over any areas where hunters are attempting to take them. No feeders, feeding, baiting, food plots, or other methods to attract deer are allowed.

21. SAFETY FIRST. Safety should be the main concern in all hunting activities. All members should:
 - a. Utilize the Buddy System whenever possible.
 - b. Use fall restraint systems for elevated stands.
 - c. Carry cell phones and let someone know an approximate location where they are hunting in case of emergency.

22. No permanent deer stands are allowed. Stand placement and scouting will only be conducted during accessible times. ALL STANDS MUST BE REMOVED WITHIN 1 WEEK OF SEASON END DATE and must have the name and phone number of the owner affixed to the stand. Name and phone number must be legible and clearly visible from ground level. Stands and equipment should be placed in areas where they are not visible from vehicle accessible roads. Any stands or equipment that is not labeled will be confiscated.

23. No hunting allowed from maintained roads or firebreaks.

24. No hunting allowed within 100 yards of a residence, building, or road; or within 25 yards of a bike or walking trail.

25. No hunting allowed on the tarmac, mowed areas, or interior roads of the All-American Drop Zone (TA-7).

26. Hunters must be a minimum of 100 yards inside the TA and weapons must be oriented into the TA when hunting with shotgun, muzzle-loader, or rim-fire. CRWMP members must ensure that no bullet or projectile leaves the area they are hunting.

27. CRWMP Accompanied Hunts. CRWMP member's dependent children (age 6-23) or spouse may accompany the CRWMP member. Anyone 16 years of age or older must carry a valid AGFC Hunting License and possess a valid Camp Robinson Recreational Pass. Dependents under the age of 16 must have a Hold Harmless Agreement signed by the CRWMP member on file prior to participating in accompanied hunts. Dependents must remain in close proximity (within 25m) and be under direct supervision of the CRWMP member at all times. Dependents must be listed on the sign in sheet with the member's CRWMP number next to their name. Minimum age requirement does not apply to the youth fishing derby.

CRWMP MEMBERSHIP AGREEMENT

VIOLATION OF RULES: If a member is found in violation of any of the Rules and Regulations set forth by the CRWMP, that member will be subject to disciplinary action and will lose their CRWMP privilege. CRWMP Members must abide by all Federal, State, CRWMP, and Range Control Rules and Regulations and adhere to all established UXO reporting procedures while hunting on the CRWMP Hunting areas.

I have read and agree to abide by all rules and regulations pertaining to the Camp Robinson Wildlife Management Program (CRWMP). I understand that as a member of the CRWMP I will also be held accountable for any violation of Arkansas Game Fish Commission (AGFC) and Robinson Maneuver Training Center (RMTC) rules and regulations. If found in violation of any rules and regulations, I agree to surrender my CRWMP membership and all related cards, tags, or items provided to members of the CRWMP. I also understand that if found in violation of any AGFC or RMTC rules and regulations appropriate penalties can be imposed on me by these entities.
